

MPH Summer Disclosure Statement

Manlius Pebble Hill (MPH) requires a **Special Accommodations Form** to be submitted if a child has been diagnosed with a disability that has been determined to require special accommodations that may be based on physical, cognitive, or behavioral challenges. Forms should be submitted to the summer program office to communityprograms@mphschool.org or faxed to 315-875-2000. A copy of the child's IEP or 504 plan, if they have one, is also required to be submitted.

Please note, MPH summer programs have many transitions throughout the day and are unstructured by design to give campers independence and a variety of experiences. Some campers find this to be a dysregulating environment compared to the structure of the school setting, while others enjoy the freedom and agency of summer camp. If you would like more information about daily programming prior to registering, please call the summer program office.

It is our goal to meet the needs of each child. If it becomes apparent before registration, after registration, or during the program that our staff is unable to productively or effectively meet the needs of your child, we will cancel the reservation. A refund will be issued for the time the child is not in attendance for future weeks of the program if the proper paperwork has been submitted.

Camper Code of Conduct

The MPH summer camp is committed to providing an engaging camp experience for every camper. We strive to promote a safe, healthy, and fun environment and are dedicated to the MPH core values of authenticity, respect, curiosity, kindness, and agency. We ask that all campers and parents/guardians read this code together before arriving at camp.

Be respectful by...

- being cooperative and contributing positively to the camp experience.
- treating others with respect and courtesy.
- openly listening to others' thoughts and being aware of others' feelings.
- not taking part or leading in any bullying, harassment, or exclusion of others.
- being careful that their actions will not physically hurt others.
- respecting other campers' belongings and camp equipment/supplies.

Be responsible by accepting personal responsibility for their actions.

Be safe by always staying with their class or a buddy.

General Information

- Campers are encouraged to participate in activities to the best of their ability.
- Cell phones are not permitted to be used without approval from summer camp staff.
- Electronics are not permitted.

This experience is for ALL campers who attend the MPH summer camp. If a camper's behavior is deemed to be outside the code of conduct and/or unmanageable, the following steps will be a result:

- 1. Verbal redirection from a counselor.
- 2. If the behavior continues, the Director or Assistant Director of Summer Day Camp will meet and have a discussion with the camper.
- 3. If necessary, parents will be contacted.
- 4. Further misbehavior may lead to a reduced daily schedule or dismissal from camp. Refunds are not given when a camper's schedule is reduced or is dismissed from the program due to misbehavior.

COUNSELOR-IN-TRAINING FOR SUMMER DAY CAMP

ENTERING GRADES 9-12

Dates/Times: Weeks 1-6 (June 30-August 8), 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

Fee: \$200/week (Register for some or all weeks.)

Students who age-out of summer camp can now register for our counselor-in-training program. Our Counselorin-Training camp is a great way to learn the ropes of working at summer camp or other children's programs. CITs will work under the direction of our Assistant Summer Camp Director to assist in camp classes and other duties as assigned. CITs will have special training sessions with the MPH Division Heads and School Nurse. Limit 5 CITs per week for each level.

LEVEL 1 - CAPTAIN CIT

Grade 9 and Grade 10 (1st year)

Level 1 CITs will be Captains of their summer camp classes with grades 5-8. With their classes, they will be role models for campers and will assist counselors with activities and enthusiasm for camp while learning leadership skills and working toward Level 2.

LEVEL 2 - INTERIM CIT

Grade 10 (2nd year) and Grade 11 (1st year)

Level 2 Interim CITs will go into classrooms as actual Counselors-in-Training, taking on more responsibility and earning more counselor privileges, while working toward Level 3.

LEVEL 3 - TRAINED CIT

Grade 11 (2nd or 3rd year) and Grade 12 Level 3 Trained CITs have the necessary experience to begin immersing themselves in the counselor role at summer camp.

Please note that MPH only hires summer counselor candidates who have graduated from high school unless they have worked for our school-year extended day program. Offering the summer CIT program will allow students an opportunity to train as a counselor and possible employment upon graduation (dependent on performance and job openings).

Board Game Design Laboratory

College Application Essay (Online Only)

Entering Grades 11-12

Dates: August 4-8

Fee: \$350/week

The essay portion of the college application can be a source of anxiety, but it is really an opportunity to shine! MPH

English teacher and NYTimes published essayist, Amy Doyle, can help demystify the process in this workshop that offers practical tips and individualized coaching. On day one, the full group will meet to review the essay topics offered on the Common Application, as well as examine sample essays of successful applicants to discern what works. On days 2-4, students will have individual conference time to brainstorm a story that college admissions officers have never read, creating an "image outline" for an essay that will bring to life their intelligence, humor, and tenderness. On day 5, students will tune up their drafts with direct instruction on how to start paragraphs, how to develop and connect ideas, how to create an appropriate and resonant tone, and how to brighten their writing with strong verbs and vivid details. Students will leave the class with a completed essay. Classes will be offered through Zoom. Limit 8 students.

Driver Education

Course Fee: \$640

Driver Education begins June 30 and runs 8 weeks. Students must be 16 years old the first week of the program and possess a valid driving permit. Students attend theory and drive classes twice a week, 1.5 hours each class/drive (six hours per week), for 8 weeks to complete the required 24 hours of in-class and in-car requirements regulated and approved through the NYS Department of Motor Vehicles. Theory classes and behind-the-wheel instruction taught by certified driver education instructors.

Upon completion of the course, students will receive an MV-285 Student Certificate of Completion from New York State. This certificate includes the NY pre-licensing 5-hour course requirements, an insurance reduction certificate, and allows 17-year-old drivers to upgrade to a senior license. Our goal is to teach our students to be the most responsible, safe drivers possible. *Please go to our online registration site to view the class and drive times offered. Space is limited.*

As part of this hands-on photographic experience students will participate in photography field trips as well as group critique sessions.
